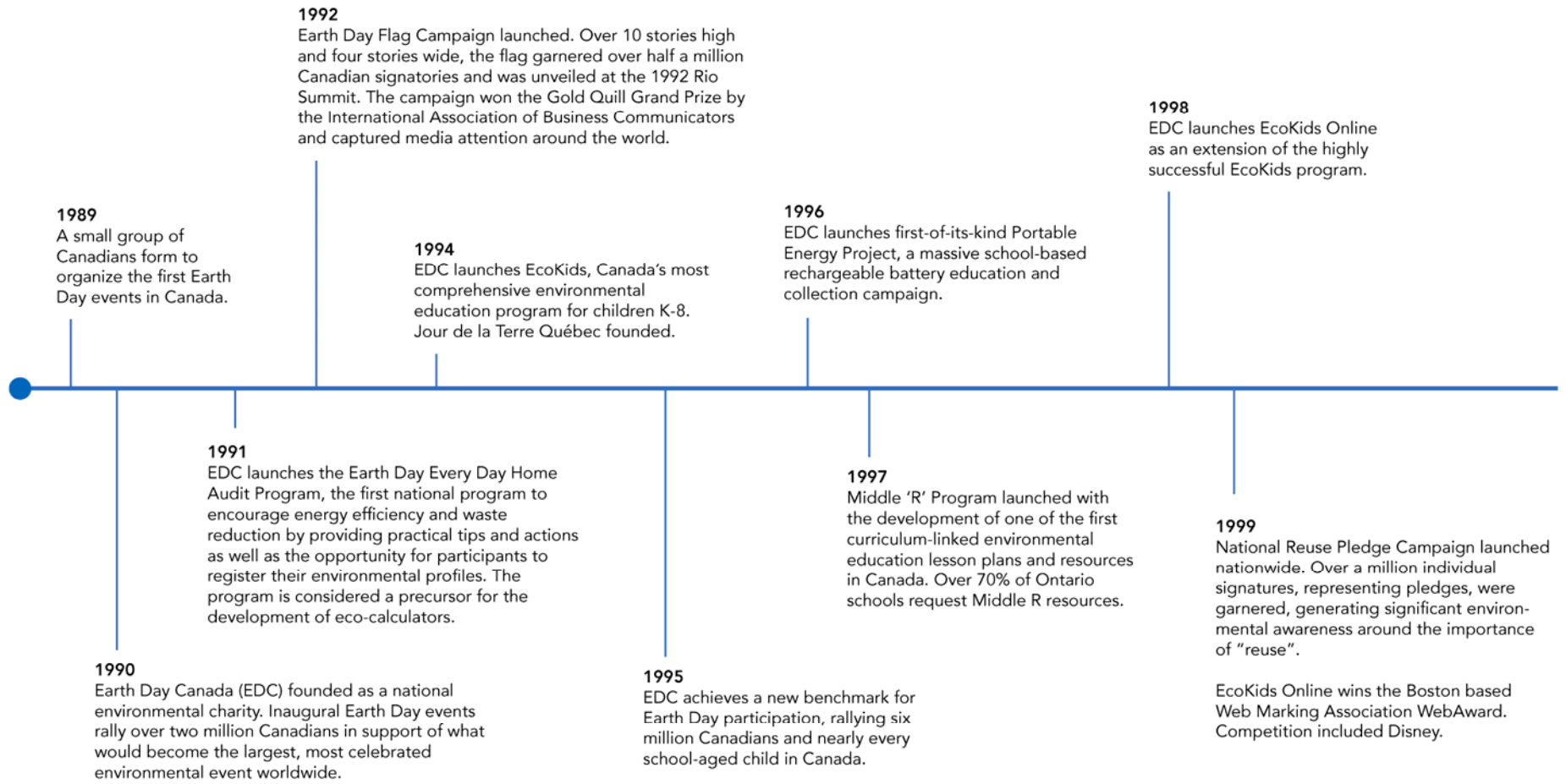

2000

EDC is the first organization to bring the concept of zero waste to Canada through the Target Zero Canada Campaign. The campaign involved conducting best-practice case studies of large corporations, and municipal and provincial governments re: the impact of zero waste initiatives.

EDC is selected by the Government of Canada's Climate Change Action Fund to develop national climate change resources that appeal to every day Canadians.

EDC selected by Natural Resources Canada to implement a nationwide Anti-Idling campaign.

2002

EDC's student reward program, the Toyota Earth Day Scholarship is launched and quickly establishes itself as Canada's pre-eminent environmental scholarship program.

2007

EcoKids is first program in Canada to offer English-as-a-Second-Language environmental education resources.

2009

EDC's financial grant program, the Community Environment Fund, is launched in Ontario.

2004

EDC's recognition of environmental achievement program, Home-town Heroes, is launched.

EDC stages the first Earth Day Canada Gala

EDC receives the Outstanding Service to Environmental Education by an Organization Award from the North American Association of Environment Education, the world's largest association of environmental educators.

2001

EDC's environmental action program, EcoAction Teams, is launched.
EDC's peer-to-peer environmental education program, EcoMentors, is launched.

2008

EDC receives the Outstanding Non-profit Organization by the Canadian Network for Environmental Education and Communication (EECOM).

2010

EDC launches the first Every Day Heroes Film Competition focusing on individual and group environmental achievement.
